

Highlights



Moab, Utah is one of the premier off-road and four-wheel drive destinations. Comprised of some of the most well-known trails in all of the United States it has trail types that suit all drivers wheeling desires. Some would call it an "off-roader's paradise". Amongst these trails, Hurrah Pass is one of the more popular "easy" trails in the entire area. It overlooks the Colorado River and potash evaporation ponds. Many people couple this trail with Chicken Corners and the Catacomb Spur Trail.

Simple road with some very minor ledges. 4 low is not required.

Technical Rating: 2-2 (EASY)

Dirt and/or rocky road. Potential rocks and/or tree stumps less than 8" tall and/or vertical ledges less than 9" tall and/or near vertical ledges or waterfalls less than 12" inches. Good tire placement likely. Can be steep but with good traction.

Description

Simple dirt and rock road that gains in elevation just over 500'. Suitable for any high clearance vehicle it is popular to use this trail to get to Chicken Corners, Lockhart Basin, and The Catacomb Spur.

Waypoints

1. Trailhead (0 mi)



Continue straight along Kane Creek Road, the road you came in on. You will automatically find the trailhead and be on the trail by simply staying straight. The more difficult Kane Creek Canyon trailhead is here also on the left/southeast side of the road. There is a nice size lot on the right
